Florida's December Employment Figures Released

TALLAHASSEE – Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in December 2010 is 12.0 percent, unchanged from November. This represents 1,108,000 jobless out of a labor force of 9,245,000.

Florida's total nonagricultural employment in December 2010 is 7,193,900, a decline of 17,900 jobs (-0.2 percent) from November. The number of jobs in the state is up 43,500 over the year, an increase of 0.6 percent from December 2009. This is the sixth consecutive month of job gains over the year.

"Although 12 percent unemployment is too high, a sixth straight month of job gains over the year is a positive sign, and with Governor Scott's emphasis on strategies to spark and support job creation, we anticipate continued improvement in our economy," said Agency for Workforce Innovation Director Cynthia R. Lorenzo. "As opportunities increase, we encourage job seekers and employers to stay in regular contact with their local One-Stop Career Centers and take advantage of Florida's many available employment and training programs."

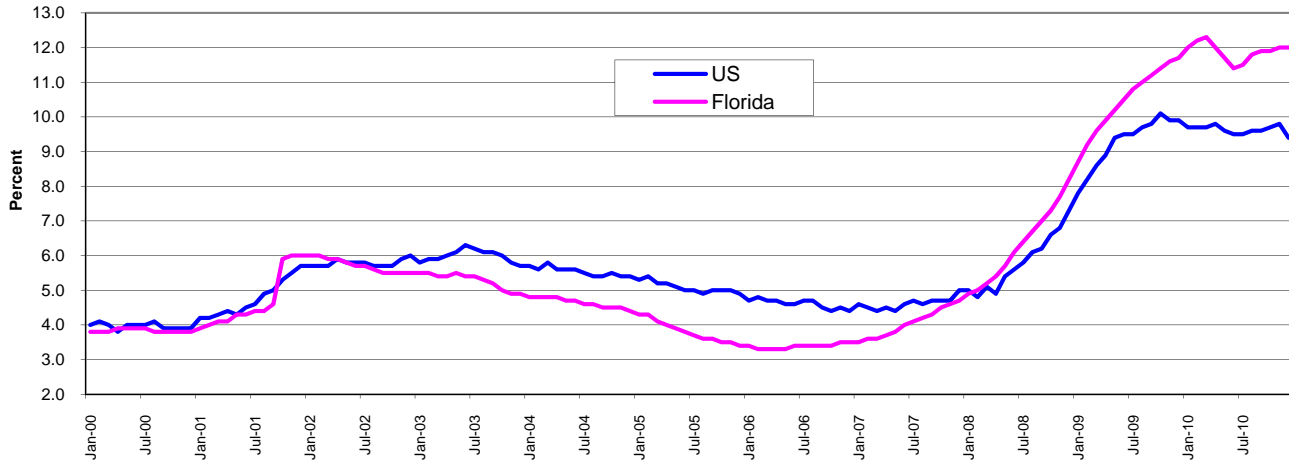
Job Training Opportunities

Funded by a \$3.46 million National Emergency Grant received by the Agency for Workforce Innovation, On-the-Job Training programs are helping employers in a wide variety of industries create training and job opportunities for unemployed workers in many parts of the state. Participants in these training programs are given a chance to "earn and learn," which means they will receive compensation while upgrading or learning new occupational skills. Participating employers receive up to 90 percent reimbursement to offset the cost of training, which helps spur economic recovery by encouraging businesses to hire workers sooner than previously planned. Opportunities for Aerospace Workers

Florida businesses are invited to apply for incentives available through a \$15 million National Emergency Grant awarded to Brevard Workforce to hire and train unemployed aerospace workers for new job opportunities. The incentives can help hire much-needed employees by covering half of the employee's salary for 90 days (up to \$9,600) if the employment is full time and is re-training the employee with a new skill. Florida's Nonagricultural Employment by Industry (Seasonally Adjusted)

- The number of jobs in Florida is 7,193,900 in December 2010, up 43,500 jobs compared to a year ago. This is the sixth annual increase in jobs since the state started losing jobs in July 2007. The industry gaining the most jobs is private education and health services (+34,500 jobs, +3.2 percent).
- Other industries gaining jobs include: leisure and hospitality (+33,900 jobs, +3.8 percent); trade, transportation, and utilities (+9,600, +0.7 percent); and other services (+9,300 jobs, +3.0 percent).
- These industry job gains are partially due to increases in ambulatory health care services; accommodation; general merchandise stores; and membership associations and organizations.
- The industries losing jobs over the year include: construction (-20,200 jobs, -5.6 percent); financial activities (-7,700 jobs, -1.6 percent); information (-5,200 jobs, -3.8 percent); manufacturing (-5,000 jobs, -1.6 percent); total government (-3,200 jobs, -0.3 percent); and professional and business services (-2,600 jobs, -0.2 percent).
- These industry job losses are partially due to weakness in specialty trade contractors; credit intermediation; telecommunications; fabricated metal product manufacturing; local government; and travel arrangement and reservation services.

Local Area Unemployment Statistics (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- In December 2010, Liberty County has the state's lowest unemployment rate (7.7 percent), followed by Monroe County (7.9 percent); Alachua County (8.2 percent); Leon and Okaloosa counties (8.3 percent each); and Wakulla County (8.4 percent). Most of the counties with the lowest unemployment rates were those with relatively high proportions of government employment.
- Flagler and Hendry counties (15.7 percent each) have the highest unemployment rates in Florida in December 2010, followed by Hernando (14.5 percent), St. Lucie County (14.1 percent), Marion County (14.0 percent), and Indian River County (13.6 percent). Flagler is experiencing continued weakness in construction, while seasonal increases in agriculture in Hendry and other counties are not enough to offset long-term job losses in other industries. There are 52 Florida counties with double-digit unemployment rates in December, down from 54 the previous month.

Area Nonagricultural Employment (Not Seasonally Adjusted)

- Fourteen metro areas out of 22 in the state have over-the-year job gains. The areas with the largest gains are Orlando-Kissimmee-Sanford (+11,100 jobs, +1.1 percent), West Palm Beach-Boca Raton-Boynton Beach (+6,900 jobs, +1.4 percent), and Miami-Miami Beach-Kendall (+3,200 jobs, +0.3 percent).
- Of the metro areas with job declines, the areas with the largest losses are Ft. Lauderdale-Pompano Beach-Deerfield Beach (-5,300 jobs, -0.7 percent), Palm Bay-Melbourne-Titusville (-2,200 jobs, -1.1 percent), Jacksonville (-1,500 jobs, -0.3 percent), and Ocala (-1,500 jobs, -1.6 percent).

Note: These unemployment and job growth rates are estimates, which are primarily based on surveys created and mandated by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in cooperation with the Florida Agency for Workforce Innovation.

The unemployment rate is derived from Florida household surveys conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau under contract with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The job growth rate is derived from Florida employer surveys conducted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Both estimates are revised on a monthly basis. In addition, these estimates are benchmarked (revised) annually based on actual counts from Florida's Unemployment Compensation tax records and other data.
